I dug up a piece of treasure. It feels smooth. It's white with red, yellow and green dots on it. It is a circle. The colour of it is very interesting.

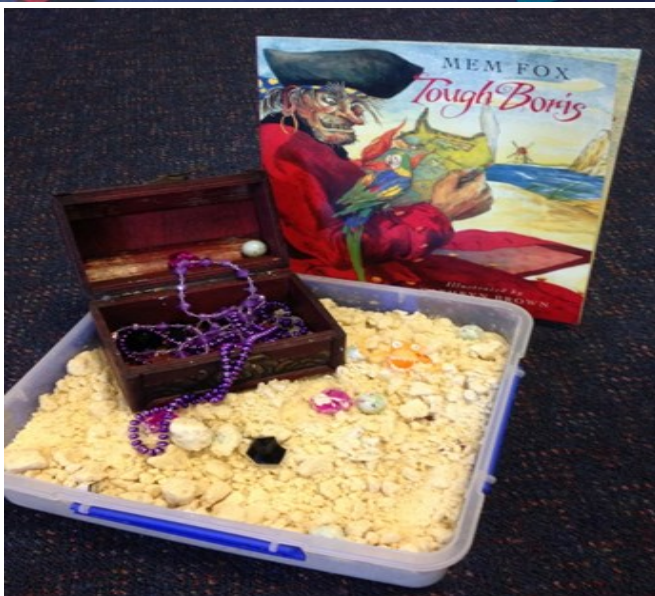

Ethics Classes at Coffs Harbour Public School

Visible Learning

According to John Hattie, Visible Learning and Teaching occurs when teachers see learning through the eyes of students and help them become their own teachers. In his ground-breaking study Hattie ranked those influences which are related to learning outcomes from very positive effects to very negative effects on student achievement. Hattie found that the average effect size of all the interventions he studied was 0.40. Therefore he decided to judge the success of influences relative to the '0.40 effect', in order to find an answer to the question "What works best in education?"

Hattie's research suggests that the most powerful effects relate to features within the school, such as the climate of the classroom, peer influences, and the lack of disruptive students in the classroom. There are a number of teacher contributions to student learning, such as teacher expectations; teachers' conception of teaching; and teacher openness. Hattie argues that the most critical aspect contributed by the teacher is the quality of their teaching as perceived by the students. Watch this space to see the top 20 factors next week.

Best Start Follow Up Assessment

At the beginning of the school year all students in Kindergarten had the benefit of a Best Start interview. At this interview the teachers were able to establish an idea of the skills and knowledge of each student in both literacy and numeracy. Following this, the teachers collated all of the responses enabling them to place each student on a continuum of learning. This is the process for every student entering Kindergarten in a public school and the results are consistently reported at

a state-wide level. The feedback to parents based on this 'assessment' is now available and parents can learn more about this at a meeting with the school's Instructional Leader next Monday, 29th February at 2.45pm in the Rainbow Room. Following the meeting the individual 'reports' will be available for parents.
