Dear Parents and Carers,

Congratulations to the 2018 Kindergarten students who took part in the Kinder transition program for the last seven weeks. The staff have commented many times on what a terrific group of children we have coming into Kindergarten next year. My thanks to the Kindergarten teachers and support staff who have offered such a wonderful taster to our incoming students. Let's hope that our new Kinders feel relaxed and confident about starting school next year.

As the 2017 school year draws to a close I would like to take this opportunity to remind students that our expectations in regard to their behaviour does not change. We expect all students to display respect and courtesy at all times, regardless of the time of year - thank you to those students who always strive to demonstrate a high standard, we greatly appreciate the example that you set.

With a bit over two weeks of the school year left, please make sure that students continue to wear the correct school uniform. If you are buying new school shoes in the holidays, please choose black shoes or runners as these are the correct colour shoes.

In planning for 2018, we will be starting the school year with classes as per the 2017 set up for at least the first week. Where possible, classes will have their current teacher. We have done this for the last few years and this has been successful for many reasons. Firstly, the students know that when they first return to school they will be in the same class group with their 2017 teacher (if possible). We can get up to 20 new student enrolments each day for the first week. This can alter our class sizes and structure. So rather than move students to their new classes on the first day, we will wait until all new enrolments turn up and then establish the 2018 classes. This could mean that new classes are only formed in the second week of school. Your child's wellbeing is at the heart of this decision as we don't want to cause any undue stress. Thank you for your understanding and patience as we try to get the correct formulation

of classes and student numbers.

In preparation for 2018 classes, could any parents who are moving home or their child will not be attending CHPS in 2018, please inform the office as soon as possible, to assist us in our future planning. Thank you.
