Welcome to Week 4!

Throughout this year we have been introducing some whole-school initiatives to ensure our students feel known, valued and cared for here at CHPS. We know that if our students are feeling a sense of belonging then they are more likely to want to be here every single day.

All staff have been reading a book called 'When the Adults Change Everything Changes', by Paul Dix. We have been meeting regularly to engage in professional learning to determine how elements of the book support staff and students here at school.

Some of the amazing initiatives we have introduced so far:

CHPS Walking

All students were involved in determining the key elements of walking around our school. Once these were decided, posters, interactive lessons and videos were designed to ensure that everybody had the same clear message about moving around our school with a sense of pride and belonging.




Meet and Greet

Every morning staff are making a point of greeting every single student as they walk into their classroom, ensuring all students feel welcome and acknowledged. Each class decided on their own set of greetings and students then choose which one they will use each morning. Some examples of these are an elbow tap, a dance or a thumbs up. Our students have really enjoyed this new routine and so have the staff!









Recognition Boards

Each class determines a goal that all students are working towards, eg. We are listening carefully to follow instructions. As students are recognised by their fellow peers for reaching that goal, their name / photo is added to the recognition board. The purpose is for students to encourage their peers and work together to ensure the whole class reaches the goal within the set time.





Deliberate Botheredness

This initiative is all about staff making a deliberate attempt to build positive relationships with students. This is already a strong focus here at CHPS, and it is about building emotional currency with our students, so they know that we care. Staff have been focussing on 'the drip effect' which is about making small and regular connections.

Teacher Certainty

All teachers have chosen to focus on a particular positive teaching strategy and measure their effectiveness and the impact of this strategy in their daily practice. Examples of these are focussing positive attention on effort rather than achievement, deliberately noticing something about each child and ending each lesson with positive reflections. Staff will be sharing their stories and reflecting on the results of their shift in practice at our next Book Club professional learning.






1B have been learning to control their bodies in different situations. This has helped us to control how we move, act and react.



In past months, the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) have conducted a report on banks delivering programs in schools. This has resulted in a number of state and territory governments announcing bans on banks delivering programs in their schools, and the NSW Government announced a similar decision today.

Because of the ASIC review and these government decisions, we are unable to continue providing programs in schools and we have had to make a difficult decision to close our School Banking program nationally.

As a result, the CommBank School Banking program will not be returning to schools beyond 2021.

Reading and Numeracy Check-in Assessments

Over Weeks 3 & 4, students in Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 will participate in an online reading and numeracy Check-in assessment.

The Check-in assessment is an NSW Department of Education assessment tool to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Students will complete the assessment in class groups over the course of the two weeks.

COVID-19

Important COVID-19 Sorry Business information

Keep our communities, especially Elders, safe from COVID-19. Everyone attending a funeral and wake needs to follow strict health orders.

Do not attend if you feel unwell, even if you have been vaccinated. Go and get tested for COVID-19 nearby and self-isolate to keep others safe.


Things to consider when attending Sorry Business:

- If everyone attending a funeral is fully vaccinated for COVID-19, there is no restriction on numbers. If someone isn't fully vaccinated for COVID-19, they can only attend funerals with a maximum of 10 people.
- Check in using the NSW Government QR code or let event organisers know your name and contact details. This is so they can reach you with important information if others with COVID-19 have attended the gathering
- · Wear a face mask when you are indoors and when around others outdoors
- Keep a safe physical distance from others
- Get tested for COVID-19 nearby if you have even mild symptoms. Self-isolate until you get your test results
- Encourage anyone to go and get tested if you notice they have COVID-19 symptoms
- · Wash your hands well and often, and keep some hand sanitiser with you
- Don't share things like knives and forks, plates, cups, and cigarettes. This can put you at risk of catching COVID-19 or passing it on to others.

School Travel for 2022



2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

School Student Transport Scheme site change

On 1 October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to **transportnsw.info**. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one place.

Travel from Term 1 2022

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/students can apply or update details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a difficult period for local bus operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations increasingly difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel on a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Please also remember that students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.
