Dear Parents and Carers,

Congratulations to Miss Dallas Gittins who has been successful in gaining permanency with the Department of Education as AEO for our school. Dallas has been in this role for a number of years and we are thrilled that it has become permanent.

Over the last few weeks and continuing throughout this term, PSSA sports are on the calendar. We have teams in netball, soccer, touch footy and basketball. Every time students represent CHPS, we hear from their teachers and event organisers that our students show great sportsmanship, try their best and work together as a team. NAPLAN assessments will be conducted across NSW schools this week for students in Years 3,5,7 and 9. There are two assessments on Tuesday (language conventions and writing), one on Wednesday (reading) and one on Thursday (numeracy). Friday is a catch-up day for anyone who missed a day. Please make sure your children are ready for these by ensuring they get a good night's sleep and have a healthy breakfast beforehand.

As the days are getting a bit cooler, students are bringing jumpers and jackets to school. There are times when our lost property container is full of hats and jumpers without names. We endeavour to return lost property to children; however, it is very difficult when we can't identify the owner. Please remember to re-write your child's name on their things after they have been washed. All lost property is kept in the office.

A number of complaints have come through to the office regarding unsafe driving behaviours in Salamander Street when dropping off and picking up children. Please follow the law and be careful around all our children. Parents are asked not to drive in the bus bay between 8:00am and 9:30am of a morning or 2:30pm and 4:00pm of an afternoon. Parking is very limited and some areas have a designated wait time. The rangers and police often do spot checks around our school checking that everyone is driving and parking safely. A number of children are walking through the staff car park to get into the school grounds. This is very dangerous as it is also the drop off and pick up point for students with disability. Please use the front entrance instead. Last term a message was put in the newsletter asking for families to have their say at a meeting about better pick up arrangements / ideas. Unfortunately, we didn't have any response from any parent or carer to discuss this. If you have any suggestions please feel free to email the school with ideas.

## 'Mrs Anderson's Article'

We are pleased to see so many of our students arriving here at school on time every day. Our school day begins at 8.50am with a whole school morning assembly. During this assembly students are given a range of messages about the day ahead and we often celebrate the successes and achievements of our students during this time. We strongly encourage all students to be at school in time to participate in this morning assembly, before heading off to class for a full day of learning and social engagement. Please be reminded that if your child is away from school for any reason you need to let us know within 7 days via a reply to the automated text, a phone call to our school office or a letter written to your child's class teacher. However, if we have not received an explanation from you within 2 days, your child's class teacher may contact you to discuss the absence.

## Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- Being sick, or having an infectious disease
- Having an unavoidable medical appointment
- Being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- Exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

### The importance of arriving on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

## Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

Please feel free to contact the school to discuss your child's absence or any other concerns at any time during the day. We are all working together to ensure your child attends school as regularly as possible.

## STAGE 2 Excursion - GREAT AUSSIE BUSH CAMP



# **Compulsory School Attendance**

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

#### What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The *Education Act 1990* requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

#### The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

## What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why. Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

#### Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An *Application for Extended Leave* may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.





My child won't go to school. What should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

# What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education and Communities may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

Compulsory Schooling
Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

• Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department

may apply to the Children's Court for a *Compulsory Schooling Order*. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

• Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

## What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

#### Working in Partnership

The Department of Education and Communities recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities. If a student misses as little as 8 days in a school term, by the end of primary school they'll have missed over a year of school.
