## 3NJ

We have had a very busy Term 2. Year 3 completed NAPLAN in Week 4 and all students in 3NJ should feel proud of their efforts in striving to achieve their personal best. Here are some of the things they have been working on in the classroom:

### Literacy

In reading, 3NJ have been learning about inference. They have been developing their ability in using clues from the text and their own knowledge and experiences to make inferences about characters and events.

### Science

3NJ have been learning about the physical world around us in science. They have been investigating how gravity, friction and magnetism are all examples of forces in our world. 3NJ presented their amazing knowledge and some funny science jokes at assembly in Week 6.



### Sustainability Garden

3NJ are thrilled to be looking after one of the garden beds in our blossoming sustainability garden. Students have integrated this project with their learning in geography, writing and mathematics. Their journey started with research into how the specific climate of Coffs Harbour influences which fruit, vegetables and herbs grow best during the months of autumn and winter. They then wrote a persuasive letter to Mrs Nyhan outlining their arguments for the inclusion of their seedling of choice. In maths, students created a shopping list and calculated the total cost of planting their garden bed. They can't wait to make a meal with their freshly picked produce.




## **Got It! is coming to Coffs Harbour Public School in Term 3, 2021**
