External Validation

Once in a four year cycle each school is nominated to participate in an external validation process. This provides an opportunity for schools to discuss their judgements about their practice – and the evidence that underpins them – with a panel of peers. Our school has undergone this process throughout this term.

We were asked to collect evidence to support what our school is doing and the impact we are having in the following areas: learning culture, wellbeing, curriculum, assessment, effective classroom practice, learning and development, data skills and use, and educational leadership. We then aligned these pieces of evidence against the School Excellence Framework.

The School Excellence Framework (SEF) supports all NSW public schools in their pursuit of excellence by providing a clear description of the key elements of high-quality practice across the 3 domains of learning, teaching and leading.

Last week our school committee met with the External Validation panel for an in-depth discussion and deep dive into our evidence sets, our School Improvement Plan and other school data.

A report was prepared by the EV panel after the meeting to indicate whether evidence provided by our school supported the judgements made in our final submission.

There are three levels of rating for a school on the School Excellence Framework. They are delivering; sustaining and growing; or excelling.

The school committee and external validation panel agreed that in all three areas of Learning, Teaching and Leading our school is currently sitting in the **Excelling** stage for each one. This is wonderful news for our school.

Congratulations to all members of staff, our community and our students.

Students have been involved in eisteddfods, sporting events, debating, public speaking, spelling bees, three-way conferences about student reports and author visits. Coming up we have our Athletics Carnival, PB assemblies and Rewards Day.

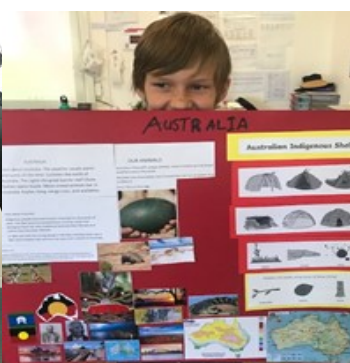
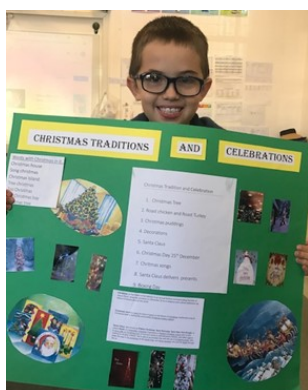
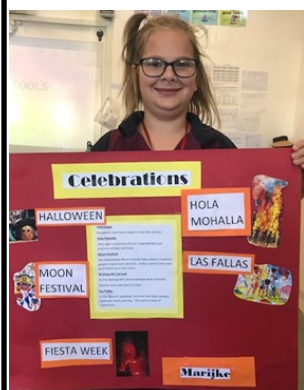
School Holidays

Australian History

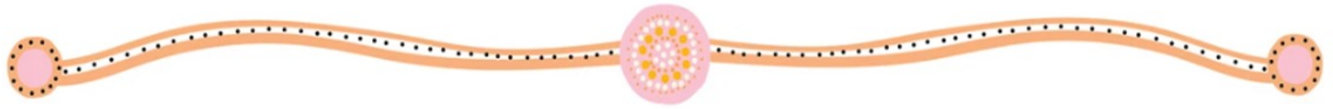

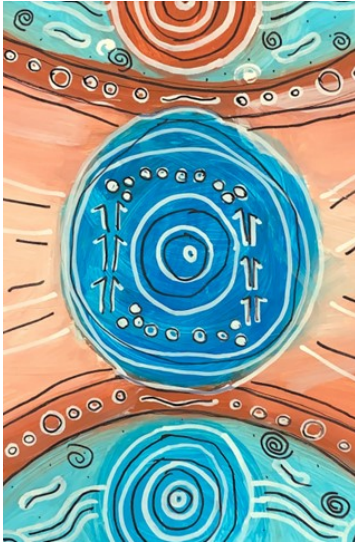

Look's what's been happening in 5/6C!!

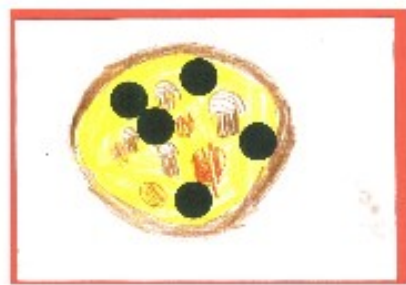
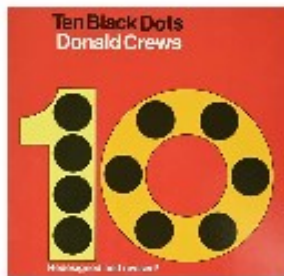
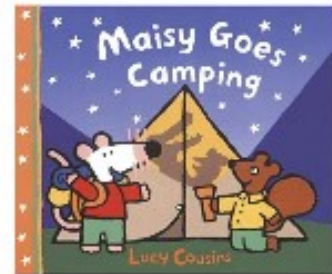

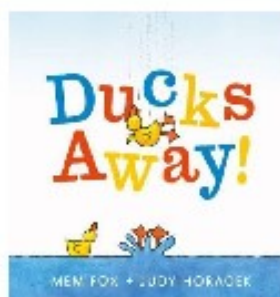
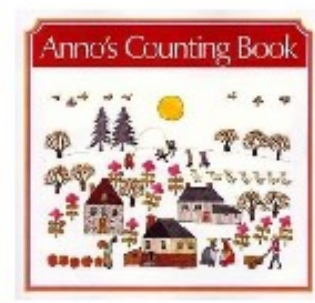


Class News KM
