COVID update

As you are already aware, the Level 4 COVID restrictions have been extended now for another 2 weeks. This means that we will continue with the same arrangements we are currently following until Friday 10th September at the earliest.

Our school will continue to be open for students who are unable to be educated at home, such as children of essential workers.

Please continue to access the Learning from Home Grids either from Seesaw or by collecting a paper copy from our bus bay between 9.30am-2.30pm each day. Paper copies are the same as what is uploaded to Seesaw, so you will only need to collect a paper copy if you are unable to access Seesaw. This week's grids were uploaded to Seesaw at 9am on Monday morning.

Please be advised that any students who are attending school are also accessing the same learning grids throughout the day and are not necessarily in their regular classes as we are operating with skeletal staff on site.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank our families for your ongoing commitment and support with these altered learning arrangements. We appreciate that it can be challenging for our families.

If you have any questions about your child's learning please call our office on 66523355 and we will organise for a staff member to call you back as soon as possible.

iPad loan service

To help students learn from home we are offering a temporary iPad loan service that allows families to access one iPad per family. This has started this week.

We have limited iPads to loan to families and therefore we will be prioritising devices for families who have no device in the first instance,

and then looking to address the needs of additional families. If you would like to borrow an iPad to assist your child/ren with their learning from home you will need to complete the google form. This can be accessed from iOS, Android, iPad or laptop. The link has been shared in English and Arabic on our Facebook page and is also listed below. Returning student's work to school.

Here are some ways you can send your work back to the school:

SeeSaw- If students are able to receive their work through SeeSaw, they are able to return it the same way. Students can do the assigned work online using SeeSaw and submit work or if they are doing work on paper or in a book click on the Post Student Work button and take a photo of the work.

Completed Work Tub- You are having trouble accessing SeeSaw and collect a paper copy of the Learning Grid from out the from outside the school, you can also return work to the same place. We have placed a yellow tub for completed work on the tables and work can be dropped of there between 9.30am & 2.30pm Monday to Friday.
