Covid Guidelines Update

A big thank you for your continuing efforts in supporting our school and students – especially prioritising safety and learning.

A combination of layered safety measures – mask wearing, rapid antigen testing (RAT), strongly encouraged vaccinations, ventilation, hygiene and cleaning – allows us to keep schools operational.

Please read the below information:

Masks

In response to NSW Health advice and the current COVID-19 situation in the state, the Minister for Education and Early Learning has strongly encouraged mask-wearing when indoors for all school-based staff and for all students, particularly for the first 4 weeks of Term 3.

At Coffs harbour Public School masks are available in all classrooms. Please discuss with your child if you would like them to wear one.

Rapid antigen testing

As part of the NSW Government's focus on minimising disruptions to teaching and learning, the department will continue to support the use of rapid antigen tests (RAT) in schools throughout Term 3.

This supply will contain 1 multipack of 5 RAT kits for every student and staff member in schools and early childhood education services, and 2 multipacks for every student and staff member in SSPs, support units and for Assisted Travel Support Officers.

At Coffs Harbour Public School RAT kits will be sent home with students from Week 2 Term 3

Close contacts

Staff and students who are identified as close contacts are allowed to attend school, providing they follow certain guidelines.

Staff and students cannot attend schools for specific purposes (SSPs) or support units as a close contact, and will be supported to work or learn from home.

This will enable staff and students who are close contacts and have no symptoms to continue to attend school if they follow guidelines agreed with NSW Health.

Note that staff and students who have had confirmed COVID-19 in the last 4 weeks, do not have to comply with these guidelines if they become a household or close contact and are not required to self-isolate or test unless they develop new COVID-19 symptoms.

Reducing the risk of illness this winter

All students, staff and their families should follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu. Schools should reinforce the following NSW Health messages with their communities:

- Stay at home if unwell or showing even the mildest of symptoms
- Keep up to date with vaccinations including the flu vaccine, which is available from your GP, pharmacy or Aboriginal Health Service
- Get tested immediately for COVID-19 if you become symptomatic and isolate until you receive a negative result or are symptom free
- Practice good hand hygiene by washing regularly with soap and water
- Take a RAT test before visiting vulnerable loved ones or going to large gatherings and events

Mathematics Learning Sprint

1H concluded Term 2 with a Mathematics Learning Sprint where the focus was on multiplicative strategies. The children explored ways to manipulate numbers in a variety of ways, i.e., sorting counters by 2s, 5s and 10s. They are building on their ability to recognise the relationship between quantities.

To finish off term 2, 1H focused on the text, Who Sank the Boat by Pamela Allen They discussed what happened when each of the animals tried to get on the boat and how it happened that it was a tiny mouse that caused the boat to sink!









Integrating a Quality Text and Science

Our focus text was *Who Sank the Boat* by New Zealand author Pamela Allen. This story encouraged the children to predict and guess which animal would sink the boat as they got in one-by-one.



They took the story further as they worked through the scientific method and did a sink and float experiment. The children made predictions then tested objects by dropping them into water to see what would happen. Lots of rich discussion resulted from this as they discussed whether they predicted correctly.
